Maciej W. Hofman European Commission DG EAC



Maciej Hofman works as Policy Officer at the European Commission where he is responsible for topics related to the role of culture in cities and regions, access to culture via digital means as well as support to cultural and creative sectors. Before coming to Brussels, he worked at the Ministry of Culture of Poland, British Council offices in Warsaw and Paris, and as a freelancer for cultural institutions, NGOs and film festivals.

In 2005 Lluís designed "Odontoca", a Museology Program for blind people, which was later presented at the "Fair of Museums and Education Congress" (Barcelona, 2006). He is currently serving in the Cultural Heritage Office of the Barcelona Provincial Council, coordinating the "The Tactile Gaze" Program.

Caisa Lindfors, CH Developer (Skane Region)



Caisa Lindfors is an expert in cultural heritage development at the Regional Government of Skåne's Department for Culture. He has been teaching languages, opening and running the Cultural Center in Hasselt, managing the Communication and Marketing of KBC Bank and Insurance. For ten years he has been President of the Jury for ethical practices in Advertising.

He held many volunteer positions. He was leader of the National Organisation of Catholic Students. The Flemish Government has called upon him to take on national tasks, such as the Presidency of the Youth Council, the Advisory board for Theater and the Government's Agency Tourism Vlaanderen. Thirty years ago, he was one of the three founders of Open Monuments Day in Flanders.

Since 2008 he is Board member of Europa Nostra and since 2015 Vice-President. Here, he is particularly involved in EU affairs and the coordination of the European Heritage Alliance 3.3, an informal platform of currently 48 European and international networks active in the wider field of cultural heritage.

Anne Grady, European Commission DG EAC



Anne is a seconded national expert in the Cultural Policy Unit of DG EAC. Before joining the Commission, she was a senior manager with the National Museum of Ireland. She was also a member of the Member States Expert Group on Digitisation and Digital Preservation and a member of both the UK and USA Overseas Tourism Marketing Initiative Working Groups. Anne introduced a number of major initiatives in Ireland, notably — National Heritage Week and a yearly admission

ticket known as the "Heritage Card".

Fausta Bressani, Dr. Veneto Region



Born in 1961, graduated in Law at the University of Padua, lawyer.

Since 2005, Director of the Office of the Veneto Region for promotion and enhancement of the cultural, material and immaterial, heritage of Veneto (cultural heritage and landscape assets, including the Unesco World Heritage List sites and the Venetian Villas); fundraising for the cultural sector and management of European projects. Prior to this assignment, she gained experience, always within the regional Administration, in the sectors of health, budget, regional advocacy.

Specialized in management and promotion of cultural heritage affairs, Sophie de Moustier is the head behind the promotion strategy of the cultural heritage at Paris Region. As an independent curator she realized a series of internationally traveling design exhibitions for Promos, a Special Agency of the Milan Chamber of Commerce (exhibitions in collaboration with the Italian Embassy, the Italian cultural institutes and in partnership with the museum Triennale di Milano). Since 2008 she is the curator and conservator of the company museum Kartell and she is part of board of directors of the Fondazione Museo

Kartell which deals with all of the museum's activities. During 2012 she curated, together with the author Hans Werner Holzwarth, the monograph "Kartell. The Culture of Plastics", edited by Taschen. At the Kartell Museo, Elisa Storace currently follows all the aspects regarding the cataloging, conservation, management and promotion of the collections and the historic archives which are part of the museum.
